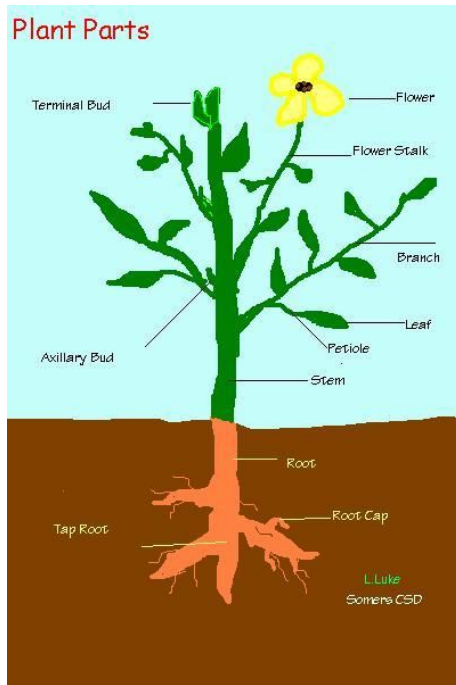
The magazine that you turn in to your teacher is a GOOD COPY. This means that you should first make a rough draft of your work. Then you should revise and edit your work before creating the magazine you will turn in during the first week of school.

Cover	Create a cover and a title for your newsletter. Be sure to make the picture colorful and big. Fill up the page
Page 1	Write an article about your topic. Be sure to include a heading above your article.
Page 2	Create a picture to go with your article. Make sure to include a caption. You must use complete sentences.
Page 3	Write an article about your topic. Be sure to include a heading above your article.
Page 4	Create a diagram (A diagram is a picture that has to do with your topic. A diagram gives information to the reader.) LABEL at least three parts of the diagram. (Labels can be one word or a group of words.)
Page 5	Write an article about your topic. Be sure to include a heading above your article.
Page 6	Create a chart (A chart organizes information). Be sure that your chart has a title to explain to the reader what the chart is about.
Page 7	Create a glossary. You must choose at least 3 words in the articles to put in the glossary. Write a definition for the word in your own words.

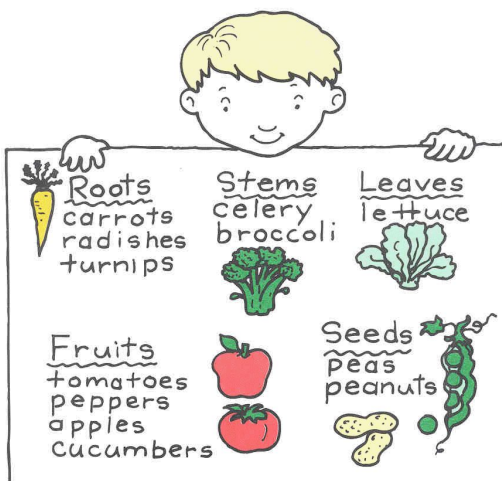
